Step 1: Speak With a Healthcare Professional

Discuss:

- Your pain and its severity
- Medical history
- Current medications
- Previous treatments
- Treatment alternatives
- Opioid-related risks

FDA recommends that extended-release/long-acting opioids be reserved for severe, persistent pain when alternatives are inadequate.

Step 2: Use a Verified Pharmacy

For any prescription opioid obtained online, verify that the pharmacy:

- Requires a valid prescription
- Has a U.S. physical address and telephone number
- Has a licensed pharmacist
- Is licensed by the appropriate state pharmacy board

These are FDA's recommended indicators of a legitimate online pharmacy.

Step 3: Don't Prioritize Fast Shipping Over Verification

Be especially cautious about websites promising **fast shipping, prescription-free access, or discontinued Opana ER**. FDA warns that unsafe online pharmacies may sell unapproved or unknown-origin prescription drugs.

Step 4: Protect Your Information

Before submitting payment or medical information, verify the pharmacy's:

- License
- Contact information
- Privacy policy
- Security practices
- Prescription procedures

Step 5: Follow Professional Guidance

If a healthcare professional prescribes an appropriate opioid medication, use it exactly as directed and discuss any questions with your prescriber or pharmacist.
